



# The Only Three Female Supreme Court Justices - \$225

The first woman to ascend to the U.S. Supreme Court, Justice O'Connor brilliantly paved the way just as Jackie Robinson did for baseball. Very good + in fine dust jacket. Dark brown paper binding with lighter brown boards and bronze titling on the spine.




**Bradley, Omar N. A Soldier's Story.** New York: Henry Holt & Company, 1951. First Edition. 5.5" x 8.25", pp. xviii 2-618 with frontispiece and 16 illustrations. Book is in very good condition with light dirt spotting, on edges. DJ is chipped at the corners as well as top and bottom of spine and along front edge. This autobiography gives historical insight of other WWII leaders like Patton and Montgomery and traces the decisions made tactics fought during the European Theater.

Omar Nelson Bradley (Feb 12, 1893 – Apr 8, 1981), was one of only five Army officers to be elevated to the rank of 5-Star General (only 9 total in all services throughout history). He was called the "GI's general" for his sensitivity and leadership for the common soldier. Ultimately, he commanded 1.3 million men which is the largest body of troops under a single field commander. After the war, Bradley headed the Veterans Administration and became Army Chief of Staff.

Bradley was appointed the first Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in 1949. Very good in good dust jacket. Tan cloth with four blue stars on the cover and red and blue titling on the spine.

Anita Faye Hill (July 30, 1956) became the unintentional face of work place harassment as a result of her sub-ordinate relationship to Clarence Thomas as exposed during his Supreme Court nomination hearings. In 1991 her interview with the FBI was leaked exposing testimony about Thomas' inappropriate nature. She was vilified during these hearings but went on to lecture and work for civil rights and against sexual harassment in the workplace. Fine in fine dust jacket. 1/2 black cloth with black paper over boards and titling in silver on spine.

"At all times, I considered myself to be working for Clarence Thomas, not the Reagan administration. It was Thomas who had inspired my allegiance. The fact that he was black was certainly a major factor in my decision to work with him. The position was one that was directly supervised by, maintained by, and related to him, not to Ronald Reagan." (p 61)



Salinger was a brilliant wordsmith who at 35 became JFK's press secretary and then LBJ's for a short time. He was briefly appointed as Senator from California in 1964 but lost to George Murphy. He returned to his press roots after moving to France, where he covered high profile stories and famous individuals for ABC. He is perhaps equally famous for his role as an antiwar, civil rights, and radical intellectual counterculture activist, as for being the former husband of actress Jane Fonda. 

Geraldine Anne "Gerry" Ferraro (Aug 26, 1935 – Mar 26, 2011) was the Vice Presidential candidate in 1984, having been selected by presidential candidate Walter Mondale. She was the first woman nominated to a major party and the only Italian American to ascend to that prominence. In 1978 she was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, where she rose rapidly in the party hierarchy while focusing on legislation to bring equity for women in the areas of wages, pensions, and retirement

plans. In 1992 and 1998 she ran for the Senate from New York but lost both races. Very good in good dust jacket. 1/2 off white cloth with similar paper over boards and titling in gilt on spine.

"Women of all ages wanted to bear witness to the first candidacy of one of their own. My candidacy had struck a chord deeper than anyone had anticipated. 'I'd vote for you if I could, but I'm twelve years old,' one girl said to me in a hotel lobby in Atlanta. An eighty-two year old woman who had never before registered to vote sent us a two-dollar check and asked the procedure for registering." (p 196)

She represented the first district from Colorado as well as woman and family rights of all Americans. "To be successful, a politician has to be good at communicating with public. There is no better training ground for developing this skill than your own daily family life. Sarah Louise Palin (Feb 11, 1964) served as the ninth, the youngest and the first female Governor of Alaska from 2006 until her resignation in 2009. In 2008 she was the Republican Party nominee for Vice President alongside, Arizona Senator John McCain. Since losing the election, she became an outspoken champion of conservative causes on the

speaking trail, on television and on many people's nerves. As new in as new dust jacket. Blue boards and spine with silver identification on spine.



Robert Joseph "Bob" Dole (July 22, 1923) served as a U.S. Senator from Kansas from 1969 until 1996, the Senate Majority Leader from 1985 until 1996 and served in the House from 1961 - 69. Dole was the Republican nominee for President of the United States in 1996 and Vice Presidential nominee in 1976, Dole is the first person to be nominated for both positions in an election but never won any of them. As a decorated 2LT in WWII with the 10th Mountain Div., Dole was severely wounded in battle in Italy. He never recovered even minimal usage of his right arm from this injury.

"Little did my mother know that as she penned those words, I was lying flat on y back on the battlefield near Castel D'Aiano, along the side of the mountain, on Hill 913, in the same spot where Sergeant Carafa and Stan Kuschik had left me six hours earlier in the day." (p 146)





Jack French Kemp (July 13, 1935 - May 2, 2009) served nine terms in Congress from Western New York (71 – 89), Secretary of Housing for President Bush ('89 – '93) and contender for the Party's Presidential nomination in 1988, as well as the Vice Presidential

nominee in 1996...and he also played football. Many of the political concepts detailed in this book were acknowledged and implemented by Ronald Reagan. Fine in fine dust jacket. 1/2 blue cloth with gray paper over boards, titling in gold on spine.

"Tax relief is not so much an end in itself as a means of getting this economy moving again. Economic growth must come first - not because it is inherently more important than other social goals, but because without growth, progress toward one goal can only be achieved by impoverishing something or someone else." John Sidney McCain III (August 29, 1936) is currently the senior U.S. Senator from AZ. He was the Republican nominee for the 2008 U.S. presidential election. McCain followed his father and grandfather, both four-star admirals, into the Navy, graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1958. In October 1967, while on a bombing mission over Hanoi,

he was shot down, seriously injured, and captured by the North Vietnamese. He was a prisoner of war until 1973. Fine in VG+ dust jacket. Black paper of boards with gold lettering on the spine.

"The realization that my captors accorded me different treatment than the other prisoners made me bolder and at times more reckless than I should have been. I also made me feel guilty to know that my courage and loyalty had not been put to the test with the same cruelty and tenacity that marked our captors' attempts to destroy the resolve of other prisoners." 

Both were

actively involved in Motion Picture fund raising activities. In 1998 Arnold Schwarzenegger was The American Cinematique Award Winner. Very good.



George Lloyd Murphy (July 4, 1902 – May 3, 1992) started his career as a dancer and actor, be-coming a leading man in many big-budget Hollywood musicals from 1930 to 1952. He was the president of the Screen Actors Guild from 1944 to 1946, and was award-ed an honorary Academy Award in 1951. Murphy served from 1965 to 1971 as U.S. Senator from California, the first notable U.S. actor to make the successful transition, predating Ronald Reagan and Arnold Schwarzenegger. He is the only U.S. Senator represented by a star on the

Hollywood Walk of Fame. Very good in very good dust jacket. Robin's egg blue stippled paper over boards with titling on spine in silver.

"It's not easy to change your politics, but in 1939, after considerable reflection, I became a Republican. And it was one of the leading Democrats in the nation who, perhaps unwittingly, convinced me I had made the right decision." (p 259)





He is acknowledged for the vociferous promotion of his firm, true and consistent liberal



Andrew Jackson Young, Jr. (Mar 12, 1932) is an early leader in the Civil Rights Movement, serving as executive director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference

and a close confidant to Martin Luther King Jr. Young later became active in politics, serving first as a U.S. Congressman from Georgia, then United States Ambassador to the United Nations, and finally Mayor of Atlanta. Since leaving political office, Young has founded or served in a large number of organizations working on issues of public policy and political lobbying. Very good + in very good dust jacket. 1/2 black cloth with black paper over boards and titling in silver on spine.



Kermit Roosevelt (Oct 10, 1889 – June 4, 1943) was the second son of T. R., the 26th President. A graduate of Harvard, he served in both World Wars and explored two continents with his father. A lifelong battle with depression was lost to suicide while

He was a true renaissance man serving as statesman, soldier, explorer, naturalist and reformer at the turn of the 20th century. Roosevelt uses this book, excerpts previously published in Metropolitan Magazine, as a platform to expound his ideas

on public service and contribution to community. Very good in not present dust jacket. Brown cloth with titling in dark green on cover and spine.

James "Jimmy" Roosevelt (Dec 23, 1907 – Aug 13, 1991) was the oldest son of U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Eleanor Roosevelt. In his own right, he was a well decorated Marine in WW II receiving both the Navy Cross. When he served as an official Secretary to the President, Time magazine dubbed him "Assistant President". Elected from the 26th District from CA, he served in the U.S. House from 1955 - 1965. Good + in not present dust jacket. "One of the big difficulties of having the President of the United States for a father was the matter of getting in to see him and capturing his full attention when one of us had a problem on which we felt we needed his advice".
